



Global Health Fellowship

The **British Maternal and Fetal Medicine Society (BMFMS)** and the **Centre for Maternal and Newborn Health at the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (CMNH-LSTM)** are collaborating to create a new **Fellowship in Maternal and Newborn Health**.

The Fellowship will allow a practising UK clinician to spend up to 12 months working alongside the award-winning CMNH team at LSTM on a research project focussed on maternal and newborn health.

This initiative will enable the successful Fellow to learn about and conduct research aligned with the global agenda to end preventable maternal and newborn deaths and to improve care in low- and middle-income countries.

The Fellow will work closely with some of the world's leading implementation researchers, dedicated to strengthening health systems, improving the availability and quality of maternal and newborn healthcare, and, building the capacity of healthcare providers in low- and middle-income settings.

The experience gained through this Fellowship is expected to have will have an impact on the individual, the community in which they will work, and, on the UK NHS. The Fellowship will facilitate the exchange of learning outcomes and a greater cultural empathy and global perspective on challenges and solutions in international health.

Research sabbaticals for medical professionals such as this are rare, so the partnership between BMFMS and CMNH-LSTM represents a 'once-in-a-lifetime' opportunity for the successful candidate.

- The Fellowship is open to all members of the BMFMS.
- Applications must be submitted by 31 October 2017.
- Interviews will be held in January 2018 and the successful candidate will take up the Fellowship no later than September 2018
